

## HRP DECISION TREES FOR THE MOVEMENT OF NON-MUTUAL DEFENSE AGREEMENT NAP 476.1 PROPERTY, MATERIALS, AND EQUIPMENT

The following flow charts are intended to aid in the decision process for transferring, exporting, moving, etc. items subject to NAP 476.1 control. This flow chart is only to be used to aid in decision making for items associated with nuclear weapons. The information from this flowchart is derived from the NAP 476.1, the R024, and NNSA OPMO/NA-10.2 guidance. Items falling under other jurisdictions should not use this process.

Recall that the NAP 476.1 separates items in a graded manner. The Tiers are as follows:

**Tier 1:** everything which involves Restricted Data or Formerly Restricted Data.

**Tier 2:** everything neither RD nor FRD, either classified or unclassified, but which reveals a specific nuclear weapon function (e.g. arming or fusing) or reveals special capabilities necessary to design, develop, produce or evaluate nuclear weapons or nuclear weapon tests or any other nuclear explosions.

Items which, if used for other purposes, would be identified by the lists of especially designed or prepared nuclear equipment and material listed in 10 CFR 110, the Commerce Control List (15 CFR 774), or the U.S. Munitions List (22 CFR 121) are considered Tier 2 when incorporated in, modified for, or manufactured for nuclear weapon-related activities, when meeting the criteria above

Tier 3: all items used in nuclear weapon-related activities which are neither Tier 1 nor Tier 2.

Both NA-10.2 and NA-PAS-112 encourage Nuclear Security Enterprise personnel to consider both the content of the item/information as well as the intended use when making decisions to export or to move within DOE/NNSA.
